Praying for the World of Work

CHRISM's purpose is: 'to help ourselves and others to celebrate the presence of God and the holiness of life in our work, and to see and tell the Christian story there'. The daily work that each of us carries out is part of our service to God – our vocation, our contribution to building his kingdom.

A major part of our task as MSEs is to help our work colleagues and the members of our congregations realise this and rejoice in it. We have a mission to support everyone by prayer and encouragement in all the different circumstances of their working lives, whether this is creativity, drudgery, decision-making, service, risk-taking, set process or individual initiative, working under direction or taking the lead, seizing an opportunity or dreading the future. When our parish clergy colleagues share this understanding, we are all liberated from valuing church members predominantly in terms of the work they do for 'the church'.

We have derived the prayer diary below from a detailed list of occupations maintained by the underwriters in a large life insurance company. It has been edited to make it reasonably gender-neutral, although a few descriptions have foiled us completely – if anyone can come up with a one- or two-word alternative for 'banksman' (person who helps road or rail vehicles to manoeuvre safely), please let us know. We have been assured that the Harbour Master qualification has been obtained by men and women. If you find that your own occupation, or one in which you have a particular interest, isn't on the list, we apologise. It won't be because that job doesn't need praying for. It is probably simply because the insurance company has never had to insure someone who did it.

'Work' covers an extraordinarily diverse range of activities, most of which never make it into an intercession list or cycle of prayer. Doctors, nurses, teachers, social and community workers, the police and aid workers feature regularly, but when did you last hear prayers (or pray yourself) for crane drivers, loss adjusters or roustabouts?

This prayer diary lists a different occupation for each day of the year, both as a focus for prayer and as a stimulus for thought about how each role fits into the complex network of activities which make up our everyday world. Looking at the list as a whole gives a wonderful impression of the glory and variety of creation, of the world in which box-office clerks, farmers and musicians labour alongside breakdown recovery patrols, stockbrokers and roofers to keep us all fed, housed, transported, informed and entertained. The sugar-beet cutter and slicer (November 24th), the HGV driver (July 10th) and the retail worker (April 16th) all make an essential contribution to marmalade, and the linesman (November 28th), gas engineer (May 8th) and glass worker (April 18th) ensure there is light to read the recipe, heat to boil the juice and jam jars for the end result.

There will be many ways to use the diary. We offer it as a catalyst, and hope that it will generate interest, prayer, enthusiasm and thanksgiving for the glorious web of work in which we and our colleagues engage each day.
